CAMPOREE FEE

- The Camporee registration fee is \$15.00 per person.
- This fee must be paid by all Scouts, adult leaders, and parents staying the weekend and participating in the Camporee activities.
- Only those paying the registration fee will receive a Camporee patch.


CAMP LOCATION: CAMP CULLOM

- Camp Cullom is located at 6815 West County Road 200 North, Frankfort, Indiana.
- A map of the camp is included in the attachments or available online.

VEHICLES AND TRAILERS

- The **ONE** vehicle pulling the Troop's trailer or hauling the Troop's equipment will be allowed to drive ahead to the camp's Main Lodge for registration.
- All other vehicles **MUST** park in the camp's main parking lot (next to the camp's playground and volleyball court).
- Only **ONE** vehicle per Troop will be allowed to drive back to the campsite.
- This rule will be strictly enforced by the Camporee staff.

REGISTRATION

- Registration will be held in the Main Lodge from 6:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m. on Friday.
 - The Scoutmaster (or adult designee) and the Senior Patrol Leader should come to the Main Lodge for registration and campsite selection.
 - All other Scouts and adults should remain outside of the lodge during registration.
 - All Troops **MUST** turn in a completed Roster Form at the time of registration.
 - A copy of the Roster Form can be found at the end of this flyer.
 - If necessary, more than one form may be used.
 - Please have the Roster Form completed prior to check in..
 - All Troops **MUST** pay their respective fees at the time of registration or pay online.
 - A single check for the total amount owed is preferred.
 - Please make checks payable to North Star District, CAC.
 - Campsites will be assigned on a first-come, first served basis.
 - After completing registration, the **ONE** vehicle pulling the Troop's trailer or hauling the Troop's equipment will proceed directly to the assigned campsite.
 - Trailers may remain in the campsites.
 - The **ONE** vehicle pulling the Troop's trailer or hauling the Troop's equipment **MUST** be moved to the camp's main parking lot as soon as possible (no later than midnight on Friday) and **MUST** stay there until Sunday morning.
 - Please understand that due to inclement weather and/or updated instructions from the camp ranger, rules relating to vehicles and/or trailers may be altered prior to your arrival. If so, please be patient and flexible.
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LEADERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

- Adult Leadership
 - BSA National policy requires that each Troop provide two adult leaders for the first ten Scouts and one additional adult leader for each additional five Scouts.
- Youth Leadership
 - A Senior Patrol Leader must be designated for each Troop.
 - A Patrol Leader must be designated for each patrol.

SCOUTMASTER AND SENIOR PATROL LEADER MEETING

- A **MANDATORY** joint meeting for all Scoutmasters (or adult designees) and Senior Patrol Leaders will be held at 9:00 p.m. on Friday in the Main Lodge.
- At this meeting, Troops will receive any last minute Camporee details/instructions.
- A snack will be available during the meeting.

CAMPSITES

- Troops should have their campsite boundaries clearly defined with a visible perimeter and a Troop flag or sign displayed at the campsite entrance.

AMERICAN, TROOP, AND PATROL FLAGS

- Troops should have an American flag properly displayed in their campsites.
- Troops are encouraged to have their Troop flag displayed in their campsites.
- Patrols should bring their Patrol flags and carry it with them during the Patrol competitions on Saturday.

FIRES, WATER, RESTROOMS, AND TRASH DISPOSAL

- Specific information about fires, water, restrooms, and trash disposal will be discussed during the Scoutmaster and Senior Patrol Leader meeting.

FIRST AID

- All attendees should have a current BSA-approved health form on file with their Troop.
- The health forms should be kept with the Scoutmaster (or adult designee) in the event of a medical emergency.
- Troops should have a first aid kit in their campsites to treat minor injuries.
- For medical emergencies, please contact the First Aid Officer at the Main Lodge.
- The closest medical facility (emergency room) to Camp Cullom is the St. Vincent Frankfort Hospital, located at 1300 South Jackson Street, Frankfort, Indiana.



ELECTRONIC DEVICES

- Scoutmasters should discourage their Scouts from using any electronic devices while at the Camporee, such as AM/FM radios, MP3 players, iPods, hand-held video games, cell phones, etc. Such devices should be put away during event hours.

CLOTHING

- All Camporee participants need to be prepared for the possibility of cold, wet, and windy Indiana spring weather.
- Scouts that are not properly dressed for the prevailing weather conditions will not be allowed to participate in the Patrol competitions until they have corrected the problem to the satisfaction of the Camporee staff.

CAMPOREE SCHEDULE

- Troops are asked to please follow closely to the Camporee schedule in order for the program to proceed with minimal interruptions.
- Cooperation with this request will be greatly appreciated by the Camporee staff.
- A copy of the current Camporee schedule can be found at the end of this flyer.
- Please note that an updated schedule may be distributed on Friday during the Scoutmaster and Senior Patrol Leader meeting.

PATROL COMPETITIONS

- Each Troop will host / staff a Patrol competition stations on Saturday:
 - Patrol Competitions should be based around the theme of Observing 100 Years of North Star.
 - This could include a competition based around an older Scout skill, something to do with the stars, anything relating to the theme as long as it is a fun event for the scouts.

PATROL EQUIPMENT

- Each Patrol should bring the following equipment to the competition stations:
 - Patrol Flag, First Aid Kit, Hatchet and Pocketknife (with Totin' Chip), Compass, Pen or Pencil and Paper.
 - Any other equipment deemed necessary by the Patrol Leader.
- If Patrols are missing any of the above listed equipment, it may hinder their participation and/or the successful completion in one or more of the Patrol competitions.

MAKE-UP OF PATROLS

- For optimal participation in the Patrol competitions, it is strongly recommended that there be six to eight Scouts in each Patrol.



PATROL COMPETITION SCORECARDS

- Each patrol competing should have a patrol name determined before the camporee.
- Scorecards if necessary will be distributed to the Patrols on Saturday morning.
- It is the responsibility of the Patrol Leaders to make sure their scorecards don't get lost or damaged due to inclement weather and their score is recorded by the adult leader at the competition stations.
- It is the responsibility of the Patrol Leaders to turn in their Patrol's competition scorecards at the Main Lodge by 4:15 p.m. on Saturday.
- Troop Adults running their competition stations must turn in their score sheets at the Main Lodge by 4:15 p.m. on Saturday
- **Scorecards will not be accepted after the 4:30 pm deadline – NO EXCEPTIONS.**

ROCKET LAUNCH WILL START AT 4:00PM AFTER THE COMPETITIONS

- Scouts are welcome to build and bring a rocket utilizing a B6-2 engine. We are trying to get a rocket club to help with the launch however we have no commitments at this time.
- Scoutmasters (or adult designees) from each troop should escort their scouts with rockets to help maintain order during the event.
- Additional details regarding the rocket launch will be discussed Friday night during the Scoutmaster and Senior Patrol Leader meeting.

THE PRARRIE GRASS OBSERVATORY

- The Prairie Grass Observatory is located at Camp Cullom and scheduled to be open the Saturday night of the Camporee.
- Details will be discussed during the Friday night meeting.

AWARDS

- Ribbons will be awarded to the Top 3 Patrols in each of the ten Patrol competitions.
- Prizes will be awarded to the Top 5 Patrols for overall placement in the Patrol competitions.

BEST CAMPSITE “WILLIE” AWARD

- Judging for the Best Campsite “Willie” Award will be conducted between 2:00 p.m. and 4:00 pm on Saturday.
- Guidelines for the “Willie” Award will be sent as an attachment.

“ADULT” BEVERAGES

- Throughout the Camporee weekend, complimentary hot coffee, hot tea, and hot cocoa will be available in the Main Lodge for all adults.



ADULT LEADER COOK-OFF COMPETITION

- Judging will take place in the Main Lodge at 6:30 p.m. on Saturday for those who would like to participate.
- All entries must be prepared under the following conditions:
 - Entrées must be cooked over a wood fire or charcoal NO Propane Grills.
- Use your imagination and be creative!
- A prize will be awarded to the winner of the cook-off.

OA LOWANEU ALLANQUE CHAPTER CALL-OUT CEREMONY

- Important information regarding the OA Call-Out Ceremony will be discussed Friday night during the Scoutmaster and Senior Patrol Leader meeting.

SATURDAY NIGHT CAMPFIRE

- The campfire will begin immediately after the OA Call-Out Ceremony.
- The campfire will be organized and emceed by Troop 269 and a few other volunteers.
- Each Troop will be asked to perform either a song or a skit during the campfire.
- Troops should “Be Prepared” with a skit or song already decided and rehearsed before arriving at the Camporee.
- Senior Patrol Leaders, on behalf of their Troops, should submit their proposed song or skit on the sign-up sheet in the Main Lodge no later than 6:00 p.m. on Saturday.

PRESENTATION OF AWARDS AND PRIZES

- The Awards Ceremony will take place during the campfire.
- The location of the ceremony will be announced during the campfire.

SATURDAY NIGHT CRACKER BARREL

- A Cracker Barrel for all adults will be held in the Main Lodge following the Awards Ceremony.

SCOUTS' OWN SERVICE

- A Scouts' Own Service will be held at 9:00 a.m. on Sunday.
- The location of the service will be announced during the Awards Ceremony.

CHECK-OUT PROCEDURES

- Troops must have their campsites inspected before departing Camp Cullom.
- Please notify a member of the Camporee Staff at the Main Lodge when you are ready for your check-out inspection.



CAMPOREE PATCHES

- All paid participants will receive a Camporee patch.
- Patches will be ordered after the Camporee and will be distributed to the Troops at District Roundtables.
